 The school is using the BPoint System for all payments which can be accessed through the school's website. This is the school's preferred method of payment. This can be done by credit card or direct debit. This facility also allows families to be on regular payment plans. All forms are in the Parent Information Package on our website and will also be enclosed with your Contribution and Charges sheet which has been sent electronically via email out to all families this week. TRANSPERTH BUS SERVICES - 2024

<u>Morning Bus Service – Southern Suburbs</u>

Students may use route 527 departing Aubin Grove Station at **7:35 am** arriving Cockburn Station at **7:39 am** approximately. Transfer to route 515 departing Cockburn at **7:49 am** arriving at Leeming High School at **8:13 am** approximately.

Morning Bus Service - East & West

Students travelling from Bateman, Kardinya, Bibra Lake or any other surrounding suburb can connect with the 515 at **8:07 am** and 516 at **8:10 am** from Murdoch Station. These buses are normal - scheduled buses that deviate via Leeming SHS. They travel down South Street, right into Findlay Road, right into Aulberry Parade and then left into Ramsdale Loop. They arrive at school at **8:16 am** (bus 515) and **8:18 am** (bus 516) approximately.

Students travelling from the Canning Vale area who alight their bus at the corner of South Street and Findlay Road, may connect with this bus at the first stop on Findlay Road at **8:23 am** approximately.

After school there are five number 515 buses leaving LSHS

- <u>Bus One,Two,Three and Four:</u> Leaving at **2:58 pm** and goes to **Murdoch Station** arriving at **3:07 pm** approximately. Students may transfer to services to Canning Vale, Livingston, Kardinya, Fremantle etc.
- <u>Bus Five</u>: Leaving at 2:58 pm and goes to Cockburn Central arriving at 3:25 pm approximately. Students may transfer to route 527 to Atwell and Aubin Grove. This service goes along Farrington Road, Karel Avenue and via Berrigan Drive to Cockburn Central.
- <u>Bus Six:</u> Leaving at **3:34 pm** approximately and goes to Murdoch Station, arriving at **3:41 pm** approximately. Travels to Murdoch Station where students can transfer services to Canning Vale, Livingston, Kardinya, Fremantle etc.

What to do if you ever feel threatened or unsafe on public transport

 If available, ask a Transit Officer or Transperth staff member for help or just stand near them for safety.



- Call 9220 9999 save this number in your mobile.
- On a train, push the emergency button to speak to the driver.
- On a bus, speak to the driver.
- On a train station, push the emergency button on an information kiosk to speak to the Central Monitoring Room.
- On train stations, stay in well-lit areas in view of security cameras.

Other Safety Tips

- If possible, have someone come to meet you, or tell friends or family when you expect to be home.
- On train stations, stand back from the yellow line on the edge of the platform. When trains go past they create a powerful draft that can unbalance you.
- Use only the proper access routes when you enter or exit train stations. Always stay off train tracks. Walking across them is dangerous and illegal.

There is an extra payment option for the Education warranty which includes accidental damage. (This includes 2 broken screens).

Minimum specifications

Parents may choose any device for their child providing it meets the minimum specifications to enable the best connection to our school network as indicated below:

- Operating System: Windows 10 Pro (or above)
- **Software: MS Office:** MS Office 365 supplied free by the Department of Education. Students can do this once they are at school. Year 7's will be shown in Digital Literacy classes.

Preferred if available:

• Touch screen & Digital Pen preferred to allow handwriting & Education Perfect.

Only computers meeting the minimum specifications provided by the school will be supported for connection to the school's network. Whilst at school, students must connect to the school's network (this allows access to the Internet and other network facilities.)



2024 LEEMING SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL BYOD FAQs

Q: Why BYOD?

A: It is a technological trend in education to make learning more seamless and interactive both in the classroom and at home, where students bring their own device at school. At Leeming SHS, we envisage using technology to ensure students are engaged in a challenging curriculum that is focused on inquiry-based learning, developing critical thinking skills and focusing on hands-on learning for students to become competent 21st Century digital citizens.

Q: How does BYOD work at Leeming Senior High School?

A: During Term 1, through Digital Literacy, Year 7 students will become acquainted with using their device on the school network. From the beginning of Term 1, all Year 7 teachers will start using the devices in their classrooms.

Year 8-12 students are expected to bring their own computing device to school every day from the beginning of the year.

Q: Does Leeming Senior High School have a preferred device?

A: Leeming Senior High School recommends a Microsoft Surface laptop, Surface Go or a Surface Pro (Pro 4 or above).

This model is a preferred device. If you have a technical background, there may be a different device you might chose. We ask that if you bring a device which is not our preferred device, you need to make sure it complies with our **minimum specifications**.

Q: What are the minimum specifications required?

A: Operating System: Windows 10 Pro or above.

Software: MS Office – The Department of Education provides free installation of MS Office 365 for all students. At the start of the year, students will need to log onto their school e-mail, click on the 365 icon, and install it from there. There are instructions on how to do this on Connect>Library>BYOD folder.

Preferred if Available

Touch Screen and Digital Pen Enabled (To allow handwriting, ie Maths use with Education Perfect).

The school decided on the Microsoft Surface Laptop, Surface Go, and Pro because of their lightweight, the capacity to be used as a tablet or as a laptop with the attachable keyboard, and the fact that it is pen-enabled. Having said that, and as noted above, a device meeting the Operating System and Software minimum specifications will also be accepted.



Q: Is there a recommended supplier?

A: **JB Education** is Leeming SHS's preferred supplier for 2024. The Leeming SHS Portal has a range of devices/prices that meet the minimum specifications required to connect to the school network.

Orders can be made via the JB Education Leeming Senior High School Portal and the store you wish to collect your device from can be selected.

JB Education has presented a range of devices/prices that all meet the minimum specifications to enable connection to the school network.

Q: Can I buy my device from an alternative supplier?

A: You can choose to buy your device from any supplier as long as you ensure that the device meets the minimum specifications and that the repair/replacement policy allows for a quick turnaround should it be required.

Q: Why do I need Windows 10 Pro?

A: Devices need Windows 10 Pro for connectivity to the school network. If your device has Windows Home, you can purchase an upgrade online.

Q: My child has a MacBook from primary school - is that ok?

A: Yes, MacBooks are able to be connected to the school network and they can also get the free version of Office 365 once students have started school. However, please be aware that there is limited functionality i.e.- some websites do not load properly and they do not have touch screen.

Q: Who owns the device?

A: At all times the device is owned by the student/parents. It is recommended that parents have access to the device and occasionally check the software, apps and other files saves on the computer to ensure that they are legal, ethical, and suitable for school.



Q: Does my child need to take the device to school every day?

A: Yes, it is part of the BYOD Agreement that all students bring their device to school every day, fully charged. (Year 7 students will be directed by their Digital Literacy teacher when to bring their device in to be set up.)

Q: Will my child use the device in every lesson?

A: No, there are some learning areas that will use the devices regularly whereas other areas may not. Teachers develop programs that incorporate the use of the technologies available to enrich the learning experiences of the students.

Q: Is the digital pen necessary?

A: Electronic platforms used in the school require a digital pen and touch screen.

(ie Maths: Education Perfect)

Q: What are my child's responsibilities when bringing the Notebooks/Tablets to school?

A: In agreeing to take part in this program, students are agreeing to use their device in an ethical, legal and responsible manner at all times – ie at school and also at home.

Students and parents must ensure that:

- The School Network & BYOD User Agreement is adhered to.
- The ICT Policy of the School is adhered to. Students must at all times use their device and the school network in a responsible manner. Normal school rules will apply to all inappropriate behaviours and use.
- They comply with all laws that apply to the internet, communications, and copyright (eg cyberbullying and plagiarism will not be tolerated).
- Privacy and security (of the student and others) will be respected, unauthorised personal information will not be shared and no attempt will be made to access personal information of others.
- Illegal copies of software, games, music files etc., are not installed/downloaded on the device for use or sharing at school.



Q: What happens if my child's device is damaged or lost at school?

A: The students and parents must accept full responsibility for the care and use of their own device. In particular, Leeming SHS does not accept responsibility for theft or loss of the device (in parts or whole) or any accessories. It is recommended that families check the details of their personal insurance coverage for events of loss or damage to the computer. If purchasing a device through the school portal, JB Education offers an optional extra Education warranty that includes accidental damage. (This is at an extra cost and includes broken screens)

Technical support is not provided for hardware or software problems that may occur with the devices (this could void your warranty). Such assistance remains the personal responsibility of the student as a private matter.

Q: Does the school help the kids with their devices?

A: To enable the efficient and effective use of the BYOD scheme during school hours, students are given access to the school network. Students will be trained and given supporting documentation on how to access school network facilities. (Library).

Q: How do students connect to the school network?

A: Upon enrolment, families will have handed in signed Learning Technologies Usage Agreement & Student Parent Memorandum of Understanding.

Year 7 students will learn how to use their device and how to connect it to the school network during Digital Literacy & Inquiry Skills lessons.

System Administrators are available at lunch time in the Library on Monday, Wednesday and Friday (all year) to assist students with their device issues and connection to the school network.

Technical support will only be available during normal school hours to assist with network issues. If a student is experiencing a connection problem with their device, it must be reported to the Library immediately.

Getting your devices delivered pronto

We offer fast, contactless delivery options for BYOD customers, including home delivery, school delivery or pick-up from a participating JB Hi-Fi retail store of your choice.

Home delivery

Contactless delivery can be made direct to your door, unless your school requires your order to be delivered to the school first.

Store pickup

You're welcome to collect your BYOD order from any participating JB Hi-Fi retail store in Australia. When ordering, you'll see that we list the five stores closest to your school to make it even easier for you.

If you choose store pickup, you'll be notified by email and/or SMS as soon as your order is ready to collect. All you have to do is show your confirmation message and provide photo identification (e.g. driver's licence) to a JB Hi-Fi staff member when you arrive at the store.

School delivery

Some schools may request that devices are delivered to the school and then handed out to students. This may occur when a school wants to add a logo, your child's identification, an image or software to the device, or they may need to connect it to the school Wi-Fi network and ensure everything is working as it should.

Our BYOD portal will advise if school delivery has been requested when you're ordering your equipment.



Your protection if things go wrong

Even the best equipment can be subject to failure or problems. That's why we're ready for anything so your downtime is never a long time.

If you experience an issue with your device within the period covered by either the Manufacturer's Warranty, Extended Warranty or the JB Hi-Fi Minimum Voluntary Warranty Policy, JB Hi-Fi will arrange a refund, repair or replacement in accordance with the terms of the policy.

How to log a warranty repair claim

- 1. Visit https://productcare.jbeducation.com.au.
- 2. Submit the details of your warranty claim.
- 3. Once submitted, you should receive a notification email confirming receipt.
- 4. A member of our warranty service team will then contact you and/or your school to determine if it is a hardware fault and then arrange repair of the faulty unit.

Whoops! Do you have accidental damage cover?


We all know that accidents happen with devices whether with food/ drink spills, dropping the device or other physical impacts that effect the usability of your asset. JB Hi-Fi offers its BYOD customers Accidental Damage Protection Insurance options that provide coverage for physical damage to a device.

These options afford you peace of mind that, should your child accidently damage their device, you can have it repaired, with the only cost being the policy excess. This will get them back to study sooner. Some of our plans combine Extended Warranty and Accidental Damage Protection Insurance, which gives you both certainty that product faults are covered for a longer period and comfort that damage caused to the device is taken care of.

If your equipment has been accidentally broken and you have not purchased any additional accidental damage cover (device insurance), please contact us via our warranty website: https://productcare.jbeducation.com.au/. One of our repair team members will give you a quote for the cost of the repair (available for Apple, Lenovo, HP and Microsoft Surface).

JB Hi-Fi also offer insurance coverage for Loss, Theft or Loss and Theft (combined). If your child misplaces their device or their device is stolen, the cost of replacement can be an unexpected (and unwelcome) expense. These additional insurance options allow you to be prepared should these unfortunate events occur.

Frequently asked questions

What to buy

How do I know what to buy for my child?

Everything on the BYOD portal has been selected and approved by your school for your child's study.

Do I need to buy software?

Your school decides what software they require. Sometimes software is included as part of the agreement with the school. Contact your school for more information.

Do I need to buy insurance or warranties?

You can buy insurance and extended warranty if you want. Options are available on the portal. You are not required to have insurance or an extended warranty. Our extended warranty options give you an extended period of coverage in relation to product faults on your device. These plans are provided by the Manufacturer and may (depending on the device selected by your school) include additional benefits such as: Onsite Repair at your school, Next Business Day Repair and/or assessment or Advance Replacement, where you will receive a new device even before your faulty device has been returned to us for assessment. These are services generally not covered by the standard manufacturer's warranty.

Our insurance options support devices with accidental damage protection coverage (and/or cover for theft or loss), which you can add-on to give you peace of mind that your child's device is protected against life's little mishaps.

The extended warranty products we sell provide protection against product faults and offer additional support that may not be covered by the standard manufacturer's warranty. In addition to the standard manufacturer's warranty, you may also have rights in relation to product faults under JB Hi-Fi's minimum voluntary warranty (see https://cmsumer.syouralleter.gov.au/consumers/consumer-rights-guarantees/repair-replace-refund for further details). You should familiarise yourself with these rights when considering extended warranty products.

What if I want my child to have a device case or other accessory?

You can choose the accessories you want for your child. You can purchase from those available on the portal or you can buy them elsewhere.

Can I choose a different colour for my child's device?

Unfortunately, no. In order to provide our special BYOD education pricing, we have to limit the product options available.

If I have more than one child at the school, do I need to place a separate order for each child?

Yes, you will need to complete an order for one child first. You will then receive an 'Order Confirmation' notification on the screen and be given an option to 'Place Another Order'. Some of your personal details will be retained so you will not have to re-enter them.

How to pay

What payment options do you accept?

There are several payment options we accept for your BYOD purchase. Credit Card, BPAY, our 12 Month Interest Free Finance option via Humm90, and buy now, pay later options. You can select to pay 'upfront' by credit card (Visa, Mastercard or American Express). Unless otherwise stated, full payment will be taken from your card when you select this option during checkout.

For BPAY payments, you can pay for your student's device direct from your bank account. We will provide you with our biller code and a reference number to use if you select BPAY as your preferred payment option. We do not accept BPAY payments via credit card.

We also offer an interest free option via Humm90. To apply for interest free, you will be able to complete an application through the BYOD Online Portal when you select Humm90 during checkout. Humm90 is a financial product provided by Flexi Group.

For buy now, pay later options, we've partnered with Afterpay and Zip to offer you choice and flexibility.

How do I know my credit card details are safe?

JB Hi-Fi Education uses an industry standard platform to transact all credit card payments. It is a highly secure system and all details submitted are encrypted. They do not retain any credit card numbers and your information is safe.

Can I pay for my order with JB Hi-Fi Gift Cards?

No, you cannot use JB Hi-Fi Gift Cards as a payment method for your BYOD order.

How can I see/track my order?

To check the status of your order, simply click on 'My Account' on the top right-hand side of the home page. Once signed in, the order history and status of your order will appear.

Can I cancel my order?

If you need to cancel your order, please contact our BYOD Customer Service Team.

Can I change my order?

You cannot change your order once it is placed or add accessories, extended warranty or insurance. If you forgot to add an accessory to your order, you cannot add one once the order is made.

If you would like to add or change the warranty or insurance, you can request to cancel your existing order and create a new one. Please note, if your order has been shipped or is due to be shipped in the next few days, it may be too late to cancel.

My child's device is having technical problems, what do I do?

Take the device to the school's IT department. The staff will assess the device and, if necessary, they can help you lodge a warranty claim.

If this is not possible, contact the manufacturer directly for assistance. Go to the JB Hi-Fi Education Support page (www.jbeducation.com.au/support/) for contact information for each supplier, as well as policy information for your coverage.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TOWARDS PAYMENT OF CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME – (Note: New applications need to be made each year).

The Department of Education provides an allowance to parents/guardians who are holders of the following:

- Centrelink Family Health Care Card
- Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card
- Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card (only the blue annual Veterans' Affair Card is eligible)

The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age. The allowance consists of two components:

- \$115.00 Clothing Allowance paid directly to the parent/guardian or the school.
- \$235.00 Educational Program Allowance paid directly to the school.

PLEASE NOTE that a new application needs to be made each year. To apply for the Secondary Assistance Scheme please come to the School's Finance Office before 28 March 2024. No late applications will be accepted by the Department of Education. The forms need to be completed online at the school with the parent or carer present.

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS FOR YEAR 7 TO 10

Schools are required to make sure that all students can choose an educational program that satisfies the requirements of the Curriculum. The Department of Education policy states that the maximum Voluntary Contributions that can be requested is \$235.00. These are contributions to core subjects and some electives.

COMPULSORY CHARGES FOR ALL YEARS

The Compulsory Charge/Charges are applied to students who have elected to participate in electives which incur an extra cost. (Refer to the School Education Act 1999, Section 98).

The Education Program Allowance (EPA) of \$235 for students will be paid to the school and will be applied towards education program charges in the first instance.

In accordance with the Department of Education Contribution and Charges policy, we request a 50% payment for all **Certificate Courses in Year 11 and Year 12 by 30 January 2024**. Students' participation is conditional on this payment.



VOLUNTARY APPROVED REQUESTS

TECHNOLOGY and CURRICULUM IT

Leeming Senior High School has computers, notebooks and associated printers for the students to use and these are connected to the Internet via the school's network.

Students have access to email, internet and international learning communities. We have purchased a range of software packages to meet the individual learning needs of our students. Your \$25.00 contribution enables us to continue the growth of this wonderful, but rapidly changing learning tool, and provides funds to upgrade and obtain licenses for software packages.

LIBRARY

The Library request of \$35.00 assists in the purchase and provision of resources supportive of the implementation of the school plan (Literacy). These include:

- Fiction and non-fiction print and electronic resources to promote literacy and encourage recreational reading, reading for a purpose, plus the implementation of research skills supportive of all learning areas.
- Resources include subject texts, books, online encyclopedias, newspapers, magazine subscriptions, iPads, Apps, e-Book readers, e-Books, A/V equipment, etc.

PARENT AND CITIZEN ASSOCATION & P&C BUILDING FUND AND CONTRIBUTIONS

This is a parent committee that decides on the distribution of funds collected based on current information provided by our school. The P&C Building Fund allocates funding to requested school upgrades. Please refer to the P&C letter in the Parent Information Package.

CHAPLAIN - STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

The School Chaplains are integral members of the Student Services team at Leeming SHS and a \$15.00 donation helps provide the necessary services. The Chaplains provide holistic pastoral care, mentoring, teaching on emotional intelligence and relational issues, welfare support and cultivate a greater connectedness to various support agencies and community organisations.

Additionally, the Chaplains encourage the school to have an outward humanitarian focus by supporting various projects.

The Chaplains' role is not a religious one, but rather a pastoral care role that respects the rights of individuals and their belief systems.



HOUSE AND CARNIVAL EVENTS

\$10.00 is provided to cover any Sporting Carnivals and events held at the school.

PUBLICATIONS

The school uses a number of publishing platforms to communicate with parents such as.

- Excursion and information letters to parents
- Absentee and SMS Communications System
- Newsletter (electronic)
- Compass
- Website, Facebook & Instagram

To cover the costs associated with all publications we ask parents a contribution of \$8.00 per year.

OTHER OPTIONAL COSTS

PAPER USE

Once students have used an initial \$5.00 paper allocation that is credited to them, they can purchase additional printing credit at the Library. If your child is doing subjects that are in Computing, Business Education, English or HASS there may be a higher usage of printing paper than other subjects.

YEARBOOK - SURVEYOR

This is a record of events and achievements for the year and is a great keepsake for your student. The cost is \$25.00 and must be paid by 18 October 2024. Past years copies of the Surveyor can be viewed at the School Reception. This item is provided by an outside source.

VALEDICTORY – YEAR 12 Only

The Valedictory ceremony is a formal conclusion to the Year 12 course and each student's journey through High School. The location of the ceremony will be determined at the start of 2024.

The \$115 fee for the Valedictory Ceremony (included in the Year 12 School Fees) covers venue hire, full ceremony gown hire, a school sash (for the students to keep) and a Class of 2024 photo for each student

The costs for the Valedictory tickets are paid separately from the school fees. Early in Term 4, we send our parents and guardians an e-mail containing information on the Valedictory and how to purchase a ticket and the cost.



SCHOOL BALL - YEAR 12 ONLY

The School Ball is invoiced and paid during Year 11 and it is held in Term 1 of Year 12.

ACROSS SCHOOL EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

In addition to the essential curriculum activities that are covered by learning areas, a wide range of Optional Enrichment Activities are planned for 2024 on a pay-as-you-go basis. We would prefer these payments through our BPoint system and our Compass App (School Excursions).

The school is unable to predict the exact cost of many of these optional activities that are organised by Year Coordinators. Teachers organizing these activities will always aim for the cheapest possible cost.

PAYMENTS AND CONTRIBUTIONS FAQs

Q: If you call some charges 'Voluntary', why should I pay?

A: As per the Department of Education guidelines students are entitled to participate in an educational program that satisfies the requirements of the Western Australian Curriculum and Assessment Outline. The Department of Education allocates basic funding to each school according to the number of students and gives principals and School Boards the autonomy to increase resources to their core subjects and some elective subjects.

The School Education Act 1999, School Education Regulations 2000 and Department policies establish that schools can request up to \$235 in Voluntary Contributions. Our School Board and Principal have agreed to request parents to pay Voluntary Contributions as these extra funds allow us to provide critical additional educational resources in our core subjects and some elective subjects. Every cent is allocated to the invoiced School Year and is used on that year so that it benefits your child directly.

Although its name seems to indicate they are inconsequential fees, the Voluntary Contributions allow our teaching staff to enrich their programs with what we believe are vital educational resources for the classroom

Q: What's the difference between Voluntary Contributions and Voluntary Approved Requests?

A: Voluntary Contributions are allocated to resources requested by the teaching staff for their classroom.

A: Voluntary Approved Requests are costs that the School Board has deemed necessary to keep the school in good standing and condition. In past years Voluntary Approved Contributions have helped the school purchase items such as:

- Staffroom upgrade including new air conditioning.
- New PE, Gardener, IT/Storage shed.
- New Gate near Canteen
- Disability Access to Library Electronic Library doors
- Removal of barriers in canteen to allow for wheelchair access.
- Ramp fitted to SS entry and front office student access Door handles also replaced as too heavy.



ACADEMIC TASK FORCE

Leeming Senior High School is happy to provide students with the opportunity to revise with Academic Task force during Year 12. Working with our school staff, Academic Task Force specialists provide students with targeted revision material to help each student reach their potential in the WACE exams.

JAPANESE SPECIALIST PROGRAM

The Japanese Specialist Program is one of only 31 Approved Academic Specialist Programs with the Department of Education.

Specialist students have the opportunity to be part of an innovate and challenging languages program designed to equip them with essential communication skills, an intercultural capability, and an understanding of the role of language and culture in human communication.

Students who are part of the Japanese Specialist Program attend two hours of Japanese classes per week, and are able to participate in the following extra-curricular activities:

- Two-week Immersion Program at Leeming Senior High School with visiting Japanese high school students.
- Two-week Japan Exchange Program (running biannually, applications open to Year 9-11 students)
- After-School Enrichment Workshops
- Various incursions and excursions arranged throughout the year exclusively for Specialist students.

LANGUAGES ATAR BONUS

• Students enrolled in an ATAR second language course are eligible for a 10% bonus on their final scores. This gives students a competitive advantage for university entrance.

LEARNING SUPPORT

Supported Small Group Learning for Literacy and Numeracy occurs twice a week. It takes the form of hourly sessions that are supervised by an Education Assistant under the direction of the Learning Support Coordinator. The small group comprises of students who have specific individual learning needs related to diagnosed conditions. Activities include specific tasks that address targeted literacy and numeracy skills, support for organisation and time management; additional guidance to complete assignments and revise for tests. Students may be offered a place in this group as a result of discussions with the Deputy Principal.



GENERAL ASSISTANCE SCHEME

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs.

To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Department of Human Services (Centrelink) or Veteran's Affairs card that represents a statement of income for the family. GENERAL INFORMATION

The State Government through the Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs.

Parents/guardians must apply for the Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS) each school year (annually) – applications do not carry forward to future years.

To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Services Australia (Centrelink) or Veterans' Affairs card that represents a statement of income for the family.

The allowance consists of two components:

- \$115 Clothing Allowance paid directly to the parent/guardian or the school.
- \$235 Education Program Allowance paid directly to the school.

Application is made by the parent or guardian for student/s enrolled in Years 7–12 studying a full time secondary course at a Western Australian public school.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Parent or Guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- Centrelink Health Care Card
- Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card
- Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card

Please Note: The only Veterans' Affairs Card that meets the criteria is a blue card that is issued annually and expires in December each year. This card is income means tested.

The parent/guardian must be the holder of a card that is valid some time during first term. Students must be listed on claimant's card (except for some year 11 and 12 students, or in cases of disability/health reasons). In this instance, the school must sight both concession cards. The only exception to this is when a student holds their own health care card and has been declared independent by Centrelink (e.g. Living Away from Home). In this instance, a letter of confirmation from Centrelink needs to accompany the application. The concession card must not be expired when applying for SAS.

The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age i.e. students born in 2005 or before are ineligible in 2024.

APPLICATION FORMS

Application forms should not be altered and are to be completed at the school or emailed during Term 1 only. If completing an application via email and/or signing the application electronically, applicants must also email a copy of both sides of the applicable concession card with the application to the school. If the application form is completed prior to the commencement of Term 1 the school must complete the enrolment confirmation section to

confirm attendance. (Forms dated by the school prior to Term 1, 2024 will not be accepted). Please ensure you keep a photocopy of the signed form for school records.

Personal information collected will only be used for the purpose of managing the Secondary Assistance Scheme. The Department will not disclose your personal information for any other reason.

LATE APPLICATIONS

Late applications will only be accepted in extenuating circumstances and must be accompanied with a written explanation.

Eligible interstate or overseas students who are enrolled after first term may apply for the allowance. Date of enrolment must be noted on the application.

CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

Schools will receive the Education Program Allowance of \$235 for Secondary Assistance recipients. This will be applied towards education program charges in the first instance, with any residual to be applied to the voluntary contribution (for years 7 to 10) or as negotiated with the parent/guardian (for years 11 to 12).

CLOTHING ALLOWANCE

The clothing allowance of \$115 will be paid to the parent/guardian unless indicated on the application form that you wish it to be paid to the school. If payment to the parent/guardian is requested, the payment will be deposited into the parent/guardian bank account. It can take between 8 to 12 weeks to receive this payment.

PROCESSING OF PAYMENTS

Once the form is completed by the parent/guardian, the school will witness the application and submit to the Financial Planning and Resourcing Directorate for processing via:

• electronic file (via email) whilst retaining the original application form at the school

or

• posting the **original application forms** retaining a photocopy for the school records.

We will endeavour to have all clothing payments made to the parent/guardian by 31 May 2024.

QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE FOR PARENTS

Absences

If a student is going to be absent from school, please use the Compass App to contact the school with the Student's Name, Year Group, and reason for absence before 9.00 am (see the Compass Flyer in the Parents Package and on the school website.)

Illness during the Day

Students who are ill during the day should inform their classroom teacher or report to the Nurse or Student Services. The School Nurse works 4 days per week. If the student needs to leave the school and return home, the Nurse will contact parent/caregiver then send to Student Services to be signed out. Please observe the protocol by following these instructions. Students should **not** contact their parent/caregiver **prior** to speaking with school staff and no student is to leave the premises without the appropriate leave pass. Please keep your child home if they are unwell.

Lateness

Students who are late for school **must** either sign in and provide a note or ensure their parent has called in with information explaining their lateness at the Student Services Office. Unexplained lateness will result in detention.

Uniform Pass

Students not in uniform are required to report to Student Services to obtain a "Uniform Pass" before the school day begins. They must provide a written reason from their parent/caregiver as to why they are out of uniform. Unexplained uniform violations will result in detention.

Leaving School Grounds

Any student who is required to attend an appointment out of the school must bring a permission note from their parent/guardian outlining the reason for the appointment. Once this information is given to Student Services the student will be issued with a "School Leave Pass" which they must retain. No student is to leave the school grounds without the appropriate approval.

Bikes

Students who ride bicycles or scooters to and from school must park and lock them in the bicycle racks located behind the Library/Uniform Shop. Students need to provide their own lock.

Communication Guide

In a large school, the need for effective communication is paramount. The school takes every opportunity to communicate to members of our school community in a number of ways, including text, Connect, email, letters, website updates, Facebook and Instagram. Connect is the primary communication medium.

School Calendar

A comprehensive calendar is available to parents and students early in Term 1 on the school website. It contains the dates of significant events to be held during the term/year. School excursions, exam dates, report distribution dates, school development days, staff meetings and parent/teacher evenings are just some of the dates recorded. Please note that some dates might have to change as the year progresses, so check our website regularly.

Specific purpose Notices - SMS or e-mails

These are issued occasionally to inform and remind parents about specific events such as school photos, vaccinations or parent evenings.

Assemblies

Whole-school assemblies are held once a term in the Recreation Centre. Parents are invited to attend the Award Assemblies. The dates for the assemblies are published on the school calendar which can be located on the school website. Year House Group assemblies are held once a week during House Group time.

Newsletters

School newsletters are transitioning to Facebook and Instagram in 2023. The newsletters contain details of school activities, significant dates and other aspects of school life.

Daily Notices

Information for students is provided every day in the daily notices. These notices are read to students during House Group after recess. Sporting team notices, special upcoming events, and general information are just some of the information regularly included in the notices.

Student Diary

Every student is expected to use a diary. This is used to record homework, and plan assignment completion but may also be used by teachers and parents to communicate with each other.



Contact with Teachers

If you wish to make an appointment please contact the teacher directly, by telephone or e-mail. Teachers e-mail addresses can be found on the website —<u>Our School-Staff</u> or directly via Compass (click on your child mobile, send email to teacher from list). We encourage all parents to keep in regular contact with the school. When parents contact the school, it is quite possible that the staff member that you wish to speak with is teaching. In light of this, please do not expect immediate responses from teachers. The staff member will ring you back at their earliest opportunity.

Appointments for Student Services

Many students make appointments to see members of the Student Services Team. The procedure is simple:

- Students attend the Student Services building at recess or lunchtime.
- Make an appointment time.
- Show the appointment time to the relevant subject teacher.

As a matter of courtesy, appointments should be negotiated with the subject teacher to make sure that essential teaching or tests do not clash with the appointment.

• Students sign in at the Kiosk in Student Services to register their attendance.

Reports

Reports will be e-mailed and published on Connect. Students in all years will receive a report at the end of each semester. (Semester 1 and Semester 2).

Downloads

The school produces a number of brochures, including handbooks on course selection and the BYOD Policy. These publications are located on the school website and can be downloaded.

Local Media

The local paper will often contain details and pictures of special events held at the school. Success of our students in sport, academic achievements and community involvement is also submitted to the local media for publication.



Maintenance of Information

It is important that the school be notified promptly of any change of circumstance including address, phone number, including mobile phone number, email address, living arrangements and medical information. Up to date information contributes to effective communication.

Messages to Students

Parents are requested not to ask the office staff to pass messages to students, unless they are of an *urgent and serious nature*.

Parents are reminded student mobile phones are banned from the time the student arrives at school and are to be kept out of sight until the end of the school day – including before school and at break times

Health and Safety

Accident Insurance

The school recommends that students be covered by a 24-hour Personal Accident Insurance policy, including ambulance cover. Schools do not cover these costs should an ambulance be required.

Drugs

All WA High Schools have a zero-tolerance policy on drugs in school. This definition includes alcohol and tobacco. Breaches are serious and will be dealt with according to the DOE policies. Students are permitted to carry "one day, one dose" of medication such as antibiotics or analgesia.

Immunisation

At times, through Commonwealth or State Government initiatives, immunisation may take place within the school for your child. You will be kept informed through the Health Department and Leeming SHS when these programs arise. A photocopy of the student's immunisation should be attached to the health record card where possible.

A Measles Exclusion policy exists which states that if a child is not immunised against measles and if a case occurs, then the non-immunised child can be excluded from school for 14 days unless immunised within 72 hours of contact with the patient.

If there are no immunisation records the school assumes your child has not been immunised.



Skin Care

Students are encouraged to care for their skin by wearing appropriate clothing (including hats) and using sunscreen when out in the sun. Appropriate sunglasses should be worn. Hats or caps should be worn outside but should not be worn inside buildings. Daily application of sunscreen is a worthwhile, lifetime habit.

Security

Loss of clothes, bags, pens and pencils, books, files and other small items is a problem in all schools. It is essential that all personal property be clearly labelled with the owner's name. This applies particularly to bags, many of which are otherwise identical and may be taken by mistake. In general:

- Calculators should be engraved with the owner's name and the make, model, serial number recorded.
- Valuables including mobile phones and similar electronic devices are the responsibility of the student.
- Mobile phones and other valuables must be kept with the student at all times. If parents deem it essential for a student to carry a mobile phone for safety reasons, mobile phones must be turned off during school time.
- If it is unavoidable that a student has a large sum of money at school, it should be given to a teacher or the Front Office Finance Department for safekeeping for the day.
- Lockers are available and all students wishing to have a locker should see their Year Coordinator/Student Services.
- The school accepts no responsibility for loss, theft or damage to students' property as the Education Department of Western Australia does not provide insurance cover.



LEEMING SHS LIBRARY & SMARTRIDER CARD

In 2024, all new students will be issued with a new plastic library card. One side has the student's name, photo and date of birth to be used for borrowing resources from the Library and also for identification. The other side is their SmartRider for public transport through TransPerth.

If students don't need to use the SmartRider for travel, then they simply use it as a Library card. When they need to use the SmartRider, they can put money onto it at train/bus stations, phone or online.

If a student loses their card, they will need to apply at the Library for a replacement. (\$5 replacement cost)


All new students will receive a Library-SmartRider card at the beginning of the school Year (2024).


The community of Leeming Senior High School, through its School Board, has chosen to have a designated School Uniform for the following reasons:
